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
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

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## Domaine De La Mordorée : Le vigneron

Créé en 1986 par Francis Delorme et son fils Christophe, le domaine de 60 ha (en bio et biodynamie certifiées) se répartit sur 38 parcelles et huit communes. Au décès prématuré de Christophe en 2015, son épouse Madeleine et leur fille Ambre ont repris les rênes du domaine. Partisans des petits rendements, les Delorme déclinent les millésimes avec une aisance déconcertante, aussi bien en tavel, leur fief d'origine, et en lirac, qu'en châteauneuf-du-pape ou en « simple » côtes-du-rhône. Incontournable.

### « La Reine des bois » Châteauneuf-du-pape rouge 2020



L'avis du Guide Hachette des Vins 2023 :

Quelle élégance dans ce nez flatteur et généreux de raisin frais, de fraise écrasée et de cerise noire, nuancé d'une touche végétale de ciste ! Structuré et puissant, le palais déploie une matière consistante gorgée de cassis confit, étayée par des tanins gras encore serrés qui confèrent à la finale une certaine fermeté. Un Châteauneuf de caractère, bâti pour durer.



### « La Reine des bois » LIRAC rouge 2020



L'avis du Guide Hachette des Vins 2023 :

Syrah, grenache et mourvèdre pour ce rouge dont seuls 15 % des jus ont séjourné en fût. Au nez, une explosion de fraise et de cassis frais nuancés d'une pointe de cerise à l'alcool et de cumin. La bouche est dense, douce, charnue, fruitée, étirée dans une finale finement grillée et tendue de bout en bout par une juste acidité. Un Lirac de caractère.



### « La Reine des bois » LIRAC blanc 2021



L'avis du Guide Hachette des Vins 2023 :

Six cépages avec le grenache blanc en tête dans ce lirac qui distille des parfums de tilleul et d'acacia sur fond grillé et épicé. Généreuse, ample et riche mais sans lourdeur, la bouche s'enrobe de saveurs épiciées (safran) et lactées, qu'une longue finale fraîche vient équilibrer avec justesse. Une expression fidèle d'un blanc du sud.



### « La Dame rousse » LIRAC rouge 2020



L'avis du Guide Hachette des Vins 2023 :

S'annonçant par une belle robe pourpre teintée de violine, cette Dame rousse fait très bonne figure. Un duo grenache-syrah élevé en Inox, qui offre au nez un fruit mûr généreusement poivré. Riche, nette et séveuse, la bouche délivre un concentré de baies noires, ourlée de tanins consitants encore un peu serrés. Un rouge fougueux et très séduisant à la fois, qui patientera un peu en cave.



## « La Reine des bois » LIRAC 2019

Originalité de cette cuvée, la syrah domine dans l'assemblage (40 %), accompagnée à parts égales par du grenache et du mourvèdre. Née sur des sols argilo-siliceux, elle offre un profil particulièrement élégant, fait d'une belle profondeur fruitée penchant vers les fruits noirs. En bouche, l'impression que tout est contenu, que rien ne prend le dessus. Matière totalement maîtrisée avec une texture ronde, presque grasse, des tanins fluides et apaisés. Une certaine incarnation de la force tranquille qui s'allonge superbement sur la finale.

### « La Dame rousse » TAVEL 2021 - Coup de cœur

Retrouver la Dame rousse en coup de cœur n'est pas vraiment une surprise tant le tavel de la Mordorée fait régulièrement partie de nos chouchous dans le cru gardois. Grenache (60%), cinsault, syrah et clairette composent ici une ode aux tavels, ces rosés de macération, parfois un peu mésestimés depuis la vague des roses pâles. Et pourtant, ils ravissent le palais des amateurs de vin. Le tour de force est ici de marier les notes gourmandes de fraises des bois et framboises propres à l'appellation à une vraie fraîcheur salivante. BIO



### « La Reine des bois » Châteauneuf-du-pape 2020

Vin de caractère, épicé, puissant et finement mentholé, La Reine des bois reste tendue et digeste grâce à des tanins souples mais bien présents. Grenache (75%), mourvèdre, syrah, counoise et vaccarèse majoritairement élevés en cuves inox font ici un mariage heureux et équilibré, déjà plaisant à boire sur la jeunesse mais dont on sent bien qu'ils offriront aussi de superbes notes tertiaires de cuir et de sous-bois en prenant de l'âge. Vin n.9 : Robe rubis dense et brillante, reflets orangés Nez sur la cerise, la figue fraîche, le gibier. Encore grande intensité et concentration, boisé encore perceptible mais fondu (café - vanille) Extraction bien maîtrisée, léger déséquilibre sur l'alcool perçu par certains dégustateurs, graine tannique encore « collante » du bois, finale longue commence à révéler des notes d'umami. Encore très jeune !

Difficile de passer à côté de Châteauneuf-du-Pape, l'une des appellations les plus célèbres au monde. Mais connaissez-vous Beaumes-de-Venise, Rasteau ou encore Lirac ? Dans ce deuxième épisode de notre guide des vins du Rhône, nous évoquons la partie méridionale

de cette vaste région. Tour d'horizon de cette source de grands vins à la notoriété établie mais également de pépites moins connues qui représentent souvent de très bonnes affaires.

**Tavel** : on change de rive et de couleur. Toute la production est dédiée au rosé. Si vous les aimez transparents, passez votre chemin. Ceux de Tavel (à base de cinsault), tirent vers le rouge et sont clairement destinés à la table. Chez iDealwine, nous aimons **le tavel de la Mordorée** avec des rougets à la plancha. Un accord magique à essayer au plus vite !

**Lirac** : un cru discret mais qui monte pour atteindre des niveaux de qualités impressionnantes ! Les rouges sont charnus mais disposent d'une grande finesse de grain, les rosés évoquent les tavels et les blancs de très bonne tenue. Là encore, **la Mordorée** produit de superbes rouges et rosés qui vous raviront, intéressez-vous également à la cuvée du Clos du Mont-Olivet, un rapport prix/plaisir irrésistible.

## TAVEL La Reine des Bois 2021

La robe rose améthyste se parfume de marmelade de gariguette et de groseille avec un rien de poivre noir et de lavande. La bouche avoue d'entrée son caractère bien trempé, mais aussi raffiné avec ses notes fruitées acidulées, son épicé délicat, sa petite rondeur espiègle. La belle longueur nous refait pour notre plus grand bonheur le parcours aromatique à l'envers.



Assemblage de 60% de Grenache, 20% de Syrah, 10% de Clairette et 10% de Cinsault de 40 ans qui poussent sur la terrasse villafranchienne faite de galets roulés sur socle sablo-argileux du plateau de Vallongue. Vendange manuelle, éraflage à 100%, foulage et macération à froid de 48h. Fermentation à 18°C.

## 10. Domaine de la Mordorée "La Reine des Bois", Tavel 2020 (bio)

C'est la star de l'appellation. À chaque millésime, Madeleine (la mère) et Ambre (la fille) Delorme offrent un Tavel délicat, élégant, harmonieux, racé. La bouche ample, voluptueuse, aromatique, est précise et de bonne longueur. Tout simplement hors concours! On l'appréciera (vers 10°) avec des rougets grillés et des noisettes d'agneau au romarin.

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## JEB DUNNUCK 90-93

### 2021 Domaine De La Mordoree Chateauneuf Du Pape La Dame Voyageuse

The 2021 Châteauneuf Du Pape La Dame Voyageuse is darker in color and slightly more Grenache-dominated, made up of 90% Grenache and the rest Syrah, Mourvedre, Vaccarese, and Counoise. Blackberries, violets, graphite, and peppery garrigue all define the bouquet, and it's medium to full-bodied, with beautiful balance, ripe, silky tannins, and a great finish.

### 2020 Domaine De La Mordoree Chateauneuf Du Pape La Reine Des Bois

The 2020 Châteauneuf Du Pape La Reine Des Bois is a bigger, richer, more structured wine, which is normal. A blend of 80% Grenache, 10% Mourvedre, and the rest equal parts Syrah and Vaccarese, its deeper ruby/purple hue is followed by a brilliant perfume of blackberries, black raspberries, ground pepper, violets, and new saddle leather. Medium to full-bodied and concentrated, with building tannins and great overall balance, it's another wine that shows the style of the vintage brilliantly. It has plenty of up-front charm, but this beauty will evolve nicely for 15-20 years.

### 2021 Domaine De La Mordoree Chateauneuf Du Pape La Reine Des Bois

I loved the 2021 Châteauneuf Du Pape La Reine Des Bois, a ripe, sexy, juicy 2021 offering lots of red and blue fruits as well as notes of peppery garrigue and flowers. Concentrated, medium to full-bodied, and seamless on the palate, it's a brilliant expression of Grenache that will drink well for over a decade.

### 2020 Domaine De La Mordoree Chateauneuf Du Pape La Dame Voyageuse

The Grenache-dominated 2020 Châteauneuf Du Pape La Dame Voyageuse is another winner, and while this is billed as a forward, base cuvée, don't let that fool you – it's a brilliant Châteauneuf du Pape (that often represents an incredible value). A blend of 90% Grenache and small amounts of Syrah, Mourvedre, Vaccarese, and Counoise, its deeper ruby hue is followed by a beautiful array of black raspberry and mulled cherry fruits as well as Provençal garrigue, sandalwood, and spice. Medium to full-bodied, seamless, elegant, and perfectly balanced, it shows the charming, elegant, layered style of this vintage beautifully.

I loved the 2021 Lirac Blanc, one of those whites that truly over-delivers. Beautiful notes of pear, white flowers, citrus, and some salty, mineral-like nuances define this beauty, and it's medium-bodied, with terrific balance, integrated acidity, and a great, great finish. Bravo. Drink this over the coming 2-4 years.

Offering more density, the 2020 Lirac La Reine De Bois has terrific purity in its black raspberry and darker cherry fruits as well as violet, flowers, and sappy garrigue-like aromatics. Beautiful on the palate as well, it's medium-bodied, has fine tannins, a seamless, pure, gorgeous texture, and a great finish. It's a seriously good Lirac (probably the best in the appellation) that will evolve for a decade.

A blend of Grenache and Syrah (50/50), the 2020 Lirac La Dame Rousse offers a vibrant ruby/plum hue to go with a great nose of black raspberries, pepper, sappy flowers, and garrigue-like nuances. It's ripe, rounded, and textured, with fine tannins.

## 2021 Domaine De La Mordoree Tavel La Reine De Bois

Lastly, the smaller production 2021 Tavel La Reine De Bois comes from more pebbly soils (the base Tavel is more sandy soils), and while it's not as powerful as some of the past vintages, it nevertheless has remarkable purity, precision, and elegance, with beautiful notes of framboise, honeyed flowers, spice, and crushed stone. Rosé doesn't get much better in my opinion, and this is Tavel at its more elegant and seamless.

The base 2021 Tavel is another winner. More framboise, raspberry, and exotic flower notes define the aromatics, and it's medium-bodied on the palate, with bright acidity, terrific balance, and some obvious minerality on the finish. It's another winner.

## 2021 Domaine De La Mordoree Cotes Du Rhone Rose

This estate makes brilliant rosé, and the 2021 Côtes Du Rhône Rosé might be the best I've tasted from the vintage. Ripe raspberries, white flowers, and beautiful minerality define the aromatics, and it's medium-bodied on the palate, with a fresh, elegant, almost crystalline-like texture that keeps you coming back to the glass. Seemingly in between a Provencal rosé and a Tavel, it's going to be incredibly versatile on the dinner table. Don't miss it.



The season for rosé wine is upon us. Fresh vintages from around the globe have recently been released just in time for summer—though most can be enjoyed year round. ... The Rhône Valley uses many of same grape varieties as Provence but deliver fleshier, more structured rosés than their neighbors. This spry, perfumed and dry white opens with streaks of orange blossom and sun-drenched white peach. Vinified predominantly in stainless steel (with just 10% in neutral oak casks), it offers juicy stone-fruit and citrus flavors accented by hints of crushed stone and fresh herb. ## Take another look at rosé

This summer wine - ANNA LEE C. IJIMA



In Tavel, the only appellation in France devoted entirely to rosé production, **Domaine de la Mordorée**, one of the region's most distinctive winemakers, crafts a spectrum of rosés. Their blush-hued, entry-level Vin de France rosé quenches that summertime desire for immediate, fruity refreshment, suggests owner **Ambre Delorme**, who manages the estate with her mother, Madeleine. Their more richly extracted Côtes-du-Rhône rosé and powerful Tavel wines offer increasing concentrations of raspberry and black cherry flavors, aroma, and tannins. "It's often easier to explain that Tavel is more like a light red wine than a rosé," Delorme says.

"It's more of a gastronomic wine, a wine that drinks especially well year-round, even into the winter months with foods like grilled lamb with ratatouille, beef, or duck.'

## 5 rosés you can drink year round

**Domaine de la Mordorée La Reine des Bois Tavel Rosé 2021.** For those who are skeptical of these shockingly pink Grenache-based wines, Delorme suggests serving their guests blindfolded.

**« La Reine des bois »**

**Châteauneuf-du-pape 2021 rouge 16**

Tasted blind. Primary and youthful nose – plum jam, sweet spice and lavender. High, fresh, zippy acidity alongside bags of dark fruit. A bit introverted at the moment, but good fruit beneath it. Needs some time to calm. (AC)

**« La Dame voyageuse »**

**Châteauneuf-du-pape 2021 rouge 16**

Tasted blind. Dark fruits, dense blackberry and spice as well. A chewy mid palate – dark fruits. Quite ripe in style – creamy and chewy with firm tannins and a ripe vanillin finish. (AC)

**« La Reine des bois »**

**LIRAC 2021 red 16**

Tasted blind. Really juicy and inviting aromas of

biltong, violet and crushed blackberries. A taut palate with good fresh acidity throughout. The fruit shows good concentration – fig, pastille notes and blackberry with detailed (but firm) tannins. Well-structured with an attractive purity of fruit. (AC)

Tasted blind. Almond notes on the nose with a creamy, nutty richness – vanilla and fennel. A tight palate with a herbal streak, pear skin and anise. Some good freshness here to the broad and textured finish. Apricot notes come through towards the end. (AC)

**« La Reine des bois » LIRAC 2021 white 15,5**

Tasted blind. Youthful and primary aromas – fresh dough, liquorice. Good acidity here with floral notes and dark berries lurking beneath a cloak of fine tannins – good concentration of fruit that needs time to intertwine with the tannic weight but should integrate nicely. (AC)

**« La Dame rousse » LIRAC 2021 red 15,5+**

Tasted blind. Strawberry, peach and herbal nose. The palate is juicy with finely tuned tannins, cherry pie and a mineral streak through to the pure, fresh finish. Packed full of flavour and good concentration. (AC)

**« La Reine des bois » TAVEL 2021 16**

Tasted blind. Strawberry, peach and herbal nose. The palate is juicy with finely tuned tannins, cherry pie and a mineral streak through to the pure, fresh finish. Packed full of flavour and good concentration. (AC)

**« La Dame rousse » TAVEL 2021 16**

Blood orange and hawthorn berries under a veil of granite dust. Bright pink radicchio leaves, pomegranate, watermelon and a long sashay of vanilla pod pulling into the textured, neat, origami-folded framework. This really pushes the boundaries of bitter leaves v candied fruit, stony minerality v crisp linen, challenge v charm. Wait a couple of years. (TC)

# Decanter

## « La Reine des bois » Châteauneuf-du-pape 2021 **95**

**Tasted by:** Matt Walls at Rhône Valley, 01 Oct 2022

Gorgeous nose, already showing some spicy, woody complexity. Just as compelling on the palate, the tannins are plentiful and will need time to settle, but the fruit is opulent enough to wait. Very long finish. From mostly galets roulés soils from lieu-dits Bois de la Ville, La Crau and La Nerthe, fermented and aged in 80% stainless steel, 20% old barriques. All destemmed.

**Part of** Walls: the best Rhône wines to buy in the UK right now

**Tasted by:** Matt Walls at Lea & Sandeman Rhône Tasting, 20 Sep 2022

A little paler in colour than usual, this has a spicy note to the blood orange aromas and a slightly musky scent. Full-bodied, powerful, there's a touch of grip on the tongue that adds texture and interest, and a long finish. Plenty to enjoy here, this will last. Also contains 10% Clairette. The estate is now run by Ambre Delorme, a biodynamic evangelist who has led the estate to Demeter certification.

Fuller in body than most, this has plenty of watermelon and raspberry on the nose and palate, with bold acidity which contributes to the sensation of power. The alcohol does too, but it's not excessive. Long finish.

## « La Dame rousse » TAVEL 2021 **92**

**Tasted by:** Matt Walls at Lea & Sandeman Rhône Tasting, 20 Sep 2022

Blood orange and redcurrant aromas, which are presently quite discreet. Full-bodied, certainly dry and savoury with a good sense of amplitude on the palate. This estate grows across a number of different terroirs. Certified biodynamic, this Grenache, Mourvedre, Cinsault, Carignan blend tasted very Grenache-y – red plums and strawberries with a little floral, violet edge. Our tasters liked its fluidity, acidity and energy.

‘In Tavel you can only make rosé,’ explained Matt. ‘Reds or whites need to be bottled as Côtes du Rhône. But the sandy terroir is amazing – and you’re seeing a lot of experimentation there and in Lirac.’

Gonzalo Rodriguez found it ‘playful and perfumed but robust enough for food matching’. Sara Bachiorri described it as ‘elegant, beautiful, and fragrant. Very pretty’.

The highest level of alcohol of any of these and definitely amongst the very darkest in the glass – pomegranate and red cherry juice, with crimson and pink highlights. Aromatically very distinctive, with dried flowers, rose petals, garrigue herbs and a dusty, earthy minerality alongside the pink gooseberry flesh, red cherry, pomegranate and fresh plum skin notes. Very fresh and impressively concentrated on the palate, with a tight, compact dense core built around the pink grapefruit pith spine. The florality reappears on the finish, with a little *fleur d’oranger* too.

Excellent value. **91.** \*



**Domaine de la Mordorée ‘La Reine des Bois’ 2021** (Tavel; 60% Grenache; 15% Clairette; 10% Syrah; 10 % Cinsault; 5% Bourboulenc; 14.5% alcohol; biodynamically certified; from a single parcel planted on classic galet *terroir*). A lovely, limpid pomegranate pink with ruby highlights – the colour of grenadine in fact. More serious, more vinous and more ‘red’ on the nose – with almost a hint of Loire Pinot about it! Intensely floral, with those old-fashioned aromatic pink-tinged yellow roses, pomegranate and red cherry stones, but also the fruit cocktail confectionary of my childhood – and a hint of fresh basil. On the palate, this is soft and gentle on the attack with a bright, fresh pick-up as the citrus components engage and vivify the darker red berry fruit notes lifting the wine to the top of the palate as they do so. Which brings me back to Tavel. The best are deep raspberry yet dry as wit and pulsing with charisma; it's easy to understand why Liebling loved them, as did Louis XIV, their colour perfect for a monarch known as the Sun King. L'Anglois is probably the most admired (and expensive), but **Domaine de la Mordorée's La Dame Rousse** is gorgeous, with a bitter-orange tang and a cherry tint that glows . . . at least for the brief moments before, like the sunset it resembles, the wine vanishes.

Finding value in France's blue-chip wine regions may seem an impossible task, given that prices can stretch into the thousands. But while most of us have said our goodbyes to the top wines of Bordeaux and Burgundy, there is one ancient region that, for the canny buyer, offers both value and consistency: the Rhône Valley.

Often a blend of grenache, syrah and mourvèdre, the reds here can be luscious and sensuous, with ripe red berries and a slight pepperiness. Replete with dark fruit and savoury grace, the **2019 Rouge Cuvée de la Reine des Bois Domaine de la Mordorée** is a case in point.

At the end of a wine tasting I hosted recently a couple came up and asked whether I had a top tip gleaned from everything I had learnt about wine. That's a toughie, as there are so many contenders. But as I looked outside at the gunmetal skies and rain showering across the window panes, I told them the answer was simple: "Continue drinking rosé throughout the winter." There is an odd cultural mindset that we should drink light wines in the summer and heavier ones during the winter months. Hands up — I'm guilty of it myself. But when it's freezing cold outside, the fire is roaring and the heating's turned up, a glass of chilled rosé is just the thing to refresh and cut through the stuffy atmosphere.

For something more complex, there are a clutch of fine-wine estates including Bruno Clair and Domaine des Lambrays in Burgundy, **Domaine de la Mordorée** in the southern Rhône and Viña Tondonia in Rioja that produce examples of a quality that can be judged alongside the great whites and reds of the world. And rosé pairs so well with food — almost any dish with a touch of sweetness or spice, and seafood in particular.

"If a rosé wine is high enough in acidity and tannins, it could age well and become more complex over time," explains Clark, giving examples of southern French Bandol or Spanish Rioja rosés that do just that.

She notes, nevertheless, that this is rare, and Conner agrees. While Conner notes that one could cellar rosés like Whispering Angel, which is oaked much like a white Burgundy, or even the rich, deeply hued **Tavels from Domaine de la Mordorée**, these exceptions do not make the rule.
